Oakridge Estate Park Now Open

On December 10, 2018 a long awaited ribbon cutting event was held at the new eight acre Oakridge Estate Park. LA City officials representing Council District 12, Recreation and Parks Department and Commissioners, Bureau of Engineering and Prop K attended along with Friends of Oakridge volunteers and community members. The park will be managed and maintained by the Department of Recreation and Parks.

The new park is adjacent to the LA City Historic-Cultural Monument (#484). Several years were spent gathering community input before the \$1.3 million of Prop K funds were approved and allocated. A new fence separates the historic residence from the park with its natural foliage, 128 new trees, 12 picnic tables, unique themed playground equipment for ages 5-12, a small natural amphitheater with log benches, a meandering, sloped .3 mile walking trail and a fenced detention basin for water collection. The park's meadow like atmosphere is inviting and peaceful. Area children are especially enjoying the bright green bouncy tractor and mare with foal sculpture.

Oak Tree Campaign Goal Reached

The first phase of the project was completed in June 2018 with the planting of a replacement mature California Live Oak tree in the center of the motor court. The tree was dedicated to Steve Harris, former President of Friends. Attractive shrubbery and an irrigation system were added at the front of the residence. Phase two will focus on the rear of the residence. Plans call for additional oak trees, shrubbery, decomposed granite pathways and an irrigation system.
